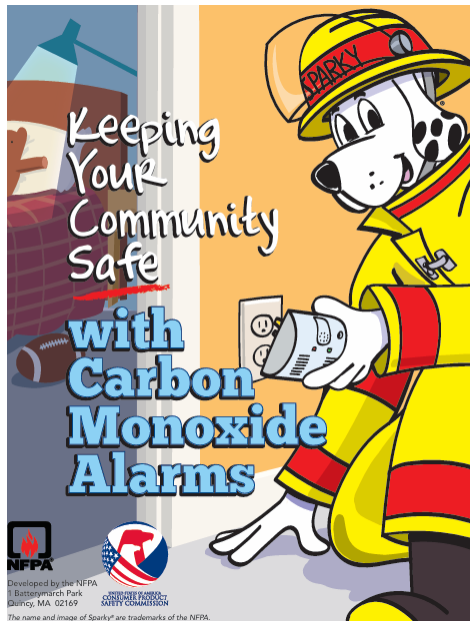

**CARBON  
MONOXIDE**

Carbon Monoxide (CO) is an odorless, tasteless, and invisible gas

Signs of CO poisoning include headache, nausea, vomiting, and disorientation

CDC estimates approximately 400 people die per year in the United States due to CO poisoning.

CO alarms should be placed within 10 feet from each sleeping area. Ideally there should also be one on each level as well.

CO alarms should be tested monthly

CO alarms typically last between 5-7 years before the sensor degrades and it needs replacement.
